I wanted to share a comment from a previous client who is a survivor of IPV and is now divorced from her abuser, has her dream job and is living in a different county. She reached out to me and told me that she appreciated every small kindness she was given while going through such a traumatic experience and she said she will never forget it. From a former client:

"I think of you every day and how thankful I am that you came into my life when you did. I'll never forget your kindness to me and my child. I know to you, you were doing a job. But you changed our lives and set us on our way to the new one that we have now. It's a beautiful peaceful life for me and my child that we've never had before. I just wanted to say thank you."

I remember working with this young mother and going through all the steps it took just to make her a client and then working with her while she navigated through the justice system, divorce court, child care, relocation, and stability. It wasn't easy, as none of these cases ever are, and we do our jobs because of our passion for our work. We never expect to be acknowledged or even appreciated but when someone reaches out to say thank you, it does something special to my heart. I am grateful we have opportunities to help people and are given the opportunity to continue to help. This for me, like so many others, is my passion and I am thankful everyday that for this fortuity.
