


This is the proclamation that was read by both our county and city mayors:

Our front door was festooned with ribbons written in by our partners, survivors, families, and staff.













Scientists believe that effects of trauma can be resolved, and that the brain can be successfully rewired.










Our Domestic Violence Training Conference
