If the liaison is unavailable, I will direct my questions to the Director of the Family Justice Center. All questions regarding confidentiality will be reviewed by the VOICES Partner Committee.

I understand that a knowing and voluntary violation of the confidentiality policy can jeopardize my relationship with the Family Justice Center.

#### Our History:

For over 35 years, our organization's mission has been to support parents and the communities where they live in creating loving homes that make children feel nurtured. In 2008, we committed to using evidence-based program models in our daily work. Our programs are rooted in research and proven to positively impact the lives of both the children and the adults in the home. In 2010, we expanded our direct services to families from three counties to 20 counties in Tennessee. Today, we provide in-home parenting support in 30 counties in Tennessee and offer several statewide programs. Previously known as Prevent Child Abuse Tennessee, we recently took on a new name to put greater emphasis on what we do, rather than what we prevent.

**Our Programs:** 

#### **Home Visiting**

Extended support offered through weekly home visits for parents from pregnancy through when their child enters kindergarten.

#### **Parenting Classes**

Concentrated parenting support provided over 8-12 weeks for parents with children age 12 and under. This program is ideal for families facing situations that impact their ability to parent.

#### **Parent Mentorship**

Parent-to-parent mentorship designed for new moms to ask questions and receive information using text messages.

# Our programs are free of charge and require no insurance or insurance eligibility. We also provide our services to undocumented residents.

#### Victim's Rights

Article I, § 35 – Rights of Victims of Crimes

To preserve and protect the rights of victims of crime to justice and due process, victims shall be entitled to the following basic rights:

1. The **<u>right</u>** to confer with the prosecution.

2. The **<u>right</u>** to be free from intimidation, harassment and abuse throughout the criminal justice system.

The <u>right</u> to be present at all proceedings where the defendant has the right to be present.
 The <u>right</u> to be heard, when relevant, at all critical stages of the criminal justice process as defined by the General Assembly.

5. The **<u>right</u>** to be informed of all proceedings, and of the release, transfer or escape of the accused or convicted person.

6. The **<u>right</u>** to a speedy trial or disposition and a prompt and final conclusion of the case after the conviction or sentence.

7. The **<u>right</u>** to restitution from the offender.

8. The **<u>right</u>** to be informed of each of the rights established for victims.

For over 50 years, Legal Aid of East Tennessee has worked to build stronger communities and improve lives by providing high-quality legal services free of charge to qualifying individuals. Each year, we serve over 6,000 neighbors and help them access vital legal help. With an estimated 300,000 eligible individuals in our service area, we know that the need is great. Our limited resources make it impossible to help everyone, but that doesn't stop us from trying.

Like many of the legal services programs that advocate for under-served communities across our country, Legal Aid of East Tennessee was initially funded by the Legal Services Corporation, a federal agency. We can continue to advocate for the elderly, victims of domestic violence, and low-income families.

LAET provides high-quality civil legal services free of charge for qualifying individuals. We are advocates for the elderly, for families, and for victims of domestic violence and work closely with our clients to help navigate legal challenges and seek out justice.

#### Services Provided by the McNabb Center

1. Silver Linings

Silver Linings is a Trauma informed Intensive Outpatient service that is provided to pregnant and postpartum women (18+) or other women who are experiencing substance abuse or have a newborn baby with Neonatal Abstinence Syndrome or other substance related birth complications. The program includes additional supports of case management, medication assessment and management, individual and family therapy as well as parenting support with a court approved curriculum and certification.

2. Children and Youth Homeless Outreach Program (CYHOP)

CYHOP is an intensive case management program for families who are homeless or at risk of homelessness with linkage to community resources as well as provided assessments for mental health and substance abuse needs.

3. Tennessee Move Initiative

The Tennessee Move Initiative is for individuals with an impatient hospitalization at Moccasin Bend Mental Health Institute of 90 days or longer and provides intensive case management and medical and peer support in reintegrating individuals back into the community. Program is for 12 months/1 year. No other requirements for enrollment in program. Program is a 24/7 program.

4. Safety Net

Safety Net is a program created by the State of Tennessee and the Tennessee Department of Mental Health/ developmental Disabilities (TDMHMM) to provide mental health treatment to individuals who do not have access to health care. This program provides outpatient medication management, community based case management, individual therapy services, and assistance in obtaining psychotropic medications. To qualify, individuals must have an Axis 1 Mental Health Diagnosis (priority population), household income at or below 100% poverty level, Tennessee resident for 6 months, United States Citizen, lack of TennCare or commercial insurance coverage, no access to VA services, and not currently an inmate.

5. Building Stable Lives (BSL)

Building Stable Lives (BSL) is a life coaching program that works with families meeting the Asset Limited Income Constrained Employed (ALICE) in Hamilton county to increase access to medical, mental health, education, employment, and housing to individuals 18 years and over who reside in the area. Individuals must have a willingness to address one of the "life domains" and have a child under the age of 18. No other requirements needed for enrollment.



#### 6. Health Link- Children and Youth

Health Link for children is designed to provide comprehensive coordination between healthcare services and mental health/social services. The program requirements include children who are at

a higher risk for intensive mental health services and chronic health conditions with a focus on preventative care, chronic illness management, and collaboration with external healthcare providers and other community partners. Tenncare eligibility is a requirement for enrollment. Health Link-Adult

Health Link for adults is designed to provide coordination with healthcare services for individuals who are at a higher risk for intensive mental health services and chronic health conditions with a focus on preventative care, chronic illness management, and collaboration with external healthcare providers and other community partners. The population served in this program are those over the age of 18 with a mental health diagnosis and who are eligible for Tenncare/Medicaid benefits.

6. Children and Youth Integrative Services Team (C&Y)

C&Y is an outpatient clinic for children needing mental health and/or substance abuse treatment. This program provides psychosocial assessment, therapy, medication assessment, and ongoing medication management for those ages 3 up. The goal is to improve the client's overall functioning and to help identify any barriers that compromise the client's emotional stability.

7. Adult Integrated Services Team

The Adult Center is an outpatient clinic for children needing mental health treatment. This program provides psychosocial assessment, therapy, medication assessment, and ongoing medication management. The goal is to improve the client's overall functioning and to help identify any barriers that compromise the client's emotional stability.

8. Trauma Specific Services

Trauma Specific Services offers assessment and ongoing psychotherapy that utilizes evidence based trauma informed interventions that include trauma focused cognitive behavioral therapy (TFCBT) and eye movement desensitization and repossessing. (EMDR). This program is a hybrid service providing treatment in the children and youth center as well as in the community.

9. Supportive Housing

Supportive housing is a housing service that offers permanent, safe, and affordable housing to individuals who are homeless and experiencing symptoms of severe and persistent mental illness. To qualify, the individual must be homeless, income below 50% of the federal poverty level, be eligible for Medicaid/Tenncare and have a mental health diagnosis



#### 10. Peer Support Center- The Lighthouse

The Peer Support Center at The Lighthouse is a rehabilitation and recovery support program that is designed to provide opportunities for developing socialization skills in a community setting while receiving support from their peers to result in higher levels of self-care and personal

development. The client must and be 18 years of age or older, have a mental health diagnosis, and not actively suicidal or physically aggressive.

#### 11. School Based Services: Better Attitudes and Skills in Children (BASIC)

School Based Services: Better Attitudes and Skills in Children (BASIC) is a classroom support program for K-3 pupils, individual and small groups, as well as teacher and parent consultations. To qualify, K-3 pupils are referred to the program by any school staff with a parent's approval or by parent themselves. No addition requirements needed for enrollment.

12. ONTrack TN Hamilton

ONTrack TN Hamilton is a program that uses evidence-based practices to treat adolescents and younger adults ages 15-30 with a mental health diagnosis that have symptoms of psychosis. Services include individual, group, and family counseling along with medication services, case management, Peer Support and employment/educational assistance. Crisis intervention and emergency services as needed. Program is a 24/7 program.

13. Therapeutic Preschool

The Therapeutic Preschool is a 10 week rolling admission intensive outpatient program for children aged 4-6 who have experienced a traumatic event. Children attend the preschool 4 days a week for 3 ½ hours a day while receiving trauma specific clinical interventions, developmental assessment, and safety planning. Additional program services include a child development specialist who supports the child in their natural environment by performing classroom/day care/home behavior observations, linkage and referral to community resources and transportation. Individual client, Parent/family sessions are offered as well as parenting groups.

14. School Based Behavioral Health Liaisons: (SBBHL)

HRMC SBBHL provide in-school social, emotional and behavioral support to students in the Red Bank, Hixson and Soddy Daisy communities. SBBHL are full time located at the school(s)



informed evidence based approaches.

#### 15. Girls Inc/YMCA/McNabb:

Through our partnership with United Way and the City of Chattanooga, HRMC provides onsite social and emotional support as well as linkage to community resources at the YMCA and Girls

Inc. The therapist is able to provide individual/family therapy as well as psycho education for participants, families and all staff at these two agencies. Services are not limited to participants in programming at either location, but rather the site is open to those living near the locations in the hopes to break down barriers to access support and services.

• Greater Chattanooga also covers McMinn county where the following services are provided:

Children, Youth and Adult outpatient mental health assessments, therapy, medication assessment and ongoing medication management, Health link services, Safety net services and Intensive Outpatient Co-Occurring services for men and women.
