#### WHO IS VOICES

The VOICES Survivor Advocacy Network is a group of survivors who...

- Volunteer their time to celebrate their strength and survival.
- Use their voices to help others through advocacy, education, and empowerment.
- Support each other as well as incoming Family Justice Center clients.
- Offer a unique perspective on a Family Justice Center's established programming and/or identify gaps in services.
- Advocate on behalf of the local Family Justice Center, not just in the early stages but for long-term sustainability.
- Help other survivors find hope and healing through programs at Family Justice Centers and Multi-Agency Centers to help them thrive.

The **VOICES Survivor Advocacy Network** is a program of **Alliance for HOPE International**. The network is comprised of volunteers who celebrate their strength and survival. These brave individuals use their voices to help others through advocacy, education, and empowerment. VOICES Committees are an important part of Family Justice Centers (FJC) in their communities. Members support each other as well as incoming FJC clients. As survivors, VOICES can offer a unique perspective in regards to a Center's established programming, and/ or identify gaps in services.

#### **VOICES History**

The first VOICES chapter was launched in San Diego in 2002. At that time, members of VOICES served as an advisory committee for the San Diego Family Justice Center, assisted with training, and spoke at various public events to bring awareness to the services provided at the Family Justice Center. A national movement was later supported by a Steering Committee, created by the Family Justice Center Alliance. VOICES is developing an outreach effort, through local chapters, to create a nationwide group of survivors to educate the public about family violence, as well as support new and existing Family Justice Centers. It is the vision of active chapters to connect and engage with other VOICES chapters nationally to share news and successes as well as collaborate on new ideas. It is the role of the Alliance to support chapters, help them network, and provide Technical Assistance to Centers wishing to establish a VOICES Committee.

What is the VOICES Committee?

Our Survivor VOICES Committee is the Chattanooga Chapter of the VOICES Survivor

<u>Advocacy Network</u>, a national program of the <u>Alliance for Hope International</u>. Our chapter was founded in April 2019.

Our VOICES Committee is a group of survivors for survivors. We aim to:

- Volunteer our time to celebrate their strength and survival.
- Use our voices to help others through advocacy, education, and empowerment.
- Support each other as well as incoming FJC clients.
- Inform the work of Chattanooga/Hamilton County Family Justice Center and ensure that the mission remains survivor-centered.

**VOICES is not a support group.** We are a group dedicated to making an impact in the community and making sure survivors' voices are heard in the work to end interpersonal violence.

You might be a good fit for VOICES if you are a survivor of some type of violence or abuse, or a family member of someone impacted by violence, and are committed to creating change. Work of the VOICES Committee

- Our VOICES Committee has assisted in the creation of the VOICES of HOPE Coloring Book, published by the National <u>VOICES Survivor Advocacy Network</u>, to promote self-care, healing, and hope for survivors of interpersonal violence. Click <u>here</u> to access the Coloring Book.
- Our clients are welcomed to our Safety Centers by this <u>Welcome Letter</u> drafted by our VOICES Committee to show them that they are not alone in their experience and have support.
- Our VOICES members participated in a <u>panel discussion webinar</u> about their experiences of healing from trauma.
- The VOICES Committee sponsored a Self-Care Kit Drive for Family Safety Center clients and hosted a <u>webinar discussing the importance of self care after</u> <u>trauma</u>.
- This website, our social media pages, and many other programs by our office are initiated or changed as a result of feedback given by our VOICES Committee!

Other activities VOICES chapters engage in:

- Community education and outreach
- Identifying gaps in services for survivors
- Planning events for survivors in the community
- Speaking to media or legislators about issues impacting survivors
- Offer in-person support to clients seeking services at the Chattanooga/Hamilton County Family Justice Center.
- Organizing activities or campaigns to raise awareness of interpersonal violence

The members of the group determine which activities are a priority for VOICES, so join us and let us know how YOU want to make a difference!

### Why should I join?

VOICES Offers a Unique Opportunity to Give Back Giving back is often a final step in the healing process, and survivors frequently contact agencies and ask to volunteer with an organization that helped them. A VOICES Committee offers a unique volunteer opportunity that thrives on the firsthand experience of being a survivor. It offers considerable benefits to the members, survivors in the process of receiving services at Centers, and the Centers themselves.

- Members experience growth and empowerment as they carry out projects that will aid and support others who are going through similar trauma.
- VOICES offers a unique experience for a group of people who were once isolated to connect and form a bond over a shared experience and a common goal of helping others.
- It provides an opportunity for survivors to find and use their voice, and to help others rediscover theirs.
- It provides a safe place to heal. VOICES members have shared, "If not for the group, I am not sure I could have healed as well as I did."

Only two requirements need to be met in order to be an eligible member of the VOICES Committee:

- Being a survivor of violence.
- Ensuring the potential member is safe and will not compromise the safety of the group as a whole.

Safety is a very subjective concept and will require ongoing dialogue among your FJC partners and your VOICES Committee members, once it has been established (a more in-depth discussion on the topic of safety can be found on page 25). Some Centers have used the following criteria to create tangible protocols that protect the safety of the VOICES Committee:

- Identify a particular length of time that the survivor should be separated from the abuse/violence before joining the Committee. Many Centers have set this at one year.
- The survivor should not currently be in a [new] relationship with a convicted abuser.
- The survivor should not currently be undergoing trial or court proceedings related to the abuse and/or separation from the abusive partner.
- Establish a method of communication between the VOICES Committee and the FJC that will ensure the safety of the members.

It is also important to ensure that your membership is a diverse representation of your community. Think about:

Language-

Do not discourage monolingual Spanish speakers from attending because the Chair, Co-Chair, and/or staff person do not speak Spanish.

If there is a monolingual applicant, consider having two VOICES groups — one in Spanish and one in English — or ask if there is another VOICES member who would be able and willing to translate.

Special populations

- Incarcerated women
- Sexual assault survivors
- Elder abuse survivors
- Domestic violence survivors
- Parents of child abuse survivors
- Survivors with/without children
- Male survivors
- LGBTQIA+ survivors
- Tribal populations
- Trafficking survivors
- Other culturally-specific populations

These unique perspectives and attributes can lead to vibrant connections with the community that may not be possible otherwise. This is especially significant when considering new partnerships with community-based agencies and outreach activities.

I understand that a knowing and voluntary violation of the confidentiality policy can jeopardize my relationship with the Family Justice Center.
